

Script to be Read to Members Viewing IEB Minutes

The UAW Constitution directs that verbatim minutes shall be taken at all meetings of the International Executive Board, except when the Board, by a seven-eighths (7/8) vote of those present, decides that the best interests of the Union would be served by an informal discussion of the membership of the Board in session as a committee of the whole. In this event, the Board shall confine itself to discussion but shall take no formal action, and no minutes shall be taken.

Copies of the minutes shall be made available to any interested member in good standing for viewing and inspection.

Members are given the right to inspect the IEB's verbatim minutes, but not to copy or remove them from the premises. This means the member shall not be allowed to duplicate the minutes in any manner, including by taking photos. Members in good standing are allowed to take notes. This shall be done under the supervision of a designated UAW International Representative at designated International Union, UAW locations.
